Welcome to the Leyendecker Museum!

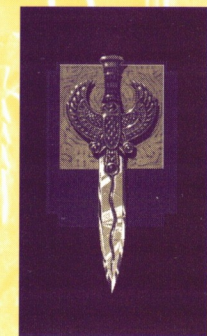

TRANSPORTATION: From Long Island and Brooklyn, take the G train to Pennsylvania Station. Take the downtown F streetcar and disembark at Hoffman and 6th Ave. Walk two blocks south to Balmoral and turn right. Walk one block to the crosstown Q streetcar and board for 6 stops. Disembark at the corner of Wallen and Wayne and proceed west to the N Shuttle Express. Take the Shuttle to the end of the line (Pennsylvania Station). Walk half a block to Bethesda and turn left. We take up the entire block and cannot be missed. From New Jersey, take the J train to Pennsylvania Station and follow the directions above.

MUSEUM STORE: The Leyendecker Museum's Gift Shoppe offers quality reproductions of many of the Museum's exhibits. Lithographs, statuettes, postcards and other fine artwork is available for cash or cheque purchase. Shoppe Hours are 12:00 pm to 3:00 pm every day except Sunday.
